She rediscovered enameling, having done it as a child, through the San Diego Community College District Continuing Education Program with instruction from Pat Aiken (2008–2012) and Rick Schneider (2012–present).

Margaret loves enameling-the beautiful colors, shaping the metal, the many techniques to choose from, and the ever present "element of surprise."

Many of Margaret's jewelry designs are done in the Sgraffito technique of enameling and take on an organic look. The Inspiration for her designs comes from what she sees around her, from nature, and from her Jewish heritage. She also enjoys torch firing, silk screening, and working with liquid enamels. She refers to her creations as "happy pieces of art."

Margaret continues to take enameling classes and other art classes/workshops of interest, always wondering how the various forms can be integrated in her creations. She plans to continue experimenting with enamels and would like to design items of creation beyond jewelry.
